Dear readers of "Jelgava in figures"!

Jelgava – a city for development – has continued its improvement as one of Latvia’s educational, industrial and cultural centers in 2019 as well. A city that encourages business development, offers a wide range of educational opportunities, secure social environment and an active cultural life.

Manufacturing and active business life is what promotes economic growth, and our city puts a lot of efforts to make every investor and entrepreneur to feel needed and welcome. By focusing on developing infrastructure, especially in industrial areas, the municipality has managed to take another step forward in arranging and adjusting the business environment, creating preconditions for the restoration of former production facilities and brownfields thus attracting private investment - the municipality has started the revitalization of industrial brownfields near Lielupe, among Garozas, Prohorova and Neretas streets, foreseeing investments in the amount of 12.5 million euros.

As the performance indicators of industry, wholesale and retail sectors in Jelgava remain high, increasing freight transport flow, the importance of high-quality transit roads is a priority - in 2019, the reconstruction of the Platone Bridge in Miera Street was completed, as well as large-scale reconstruction works of the Loka Highway is still in progress, thus improving the existing transit and freight transport routes.

Along with the improvement of the business environment, it is crucial to develop the potential of knowledge and innovation, to keep up with the requirements of the labor market and the needs of students. In 2019, we were the first in the country to implement educational reform by optimizing the network of municipal educational institutions and determining the specialization of each school to promote high quality education. In September 2019, the students of Jelgava State Gymnasium started the new school year in a fully modernized school. Also, the stadium of Jelgava Secondary School of Technology and the sports field near Jelgava 4th Primary School were reconstructed.

We are proud of our award winning buildings in the “Construction Award of the Year 2019” and “Best Building of the Year in Latvia 2019” - 1st place in the nomination "Wooden Building" - open-air concert hall "Mītava" on Pasta (Post) Island and nomination “Restoration”- renovated wooden building at Vecpilsētas Street 14, Jelgava.

The city is developing and requires more and more intellectual resources – young students hungry for knowledge and willing to learn, entrepreneurs, smart and provident. Change is the driving force of development and is the key to Jelgava's success - to be able to foresee one step ahead of events, to undertake initiative and responsibility.

About Jelgava


Jelgava is fourth largest city in Latvia by population and fifth by the territory.

Jelgava Large Coat of Arms

As approved by the National Heraldry Committee on the 24th of November, 2016, the Large Coat of Arms of Jelgava depicts two silver lions with heads looking backwards, red tongues and golden crowns, holding shield with Coat of Arms of Jelgava, standing on the silver base.

Coat of Arms

Jelgava is the only city in Latvia that contains the country's small coat of arms within its coat of arms. The city received the coat of arms at the same time as it received city rights, in 1573. The first coat of arms depicted a crowned stag head on a raspberry red field; the current coat of arms contains an elk head on a crimson field.

Flag

The City flag was approved on October 28, 1938. It is divided in two similar parts: dark blue on top and red on bottom. In the center of the flag Jelgava Coat of Arms is placed.



In 2012 Jelgava City logo was approved. The logo is made up of a contour of an elk head and the word “Jelgava”. The large antlers symbolize the rich historical experience and value of the city.

Jelgava is the only city in Latvia, whose coat of arms also heraldically depicts the small coat of arms of the country, which makes the official symbolism of Jelgava heavy and its use solemn. For everyday use, a lighter and more attractive city logo has been created, which stylizes the elk's head and the name of the city. The large and branched horns of the Jelgava logo elk symbolize the historical value and experience of the city.




On March 20th 2012 Jelgava city logo and motto were registered in the Patent Office of the Republic of Latvia as the trademark.

The greatest value of the city of Jelgava is the people who live, study and work here - for their personal and city growth. Therefore, everyone here has the opportunity to find an area in which he wants to work, gain knowledge and skills, develop professionally and express himself creatively. These are growth opportunities from preschool to seniors.



Structure for the implementation of revenues of the general budget of Jelgava city municipality in 2019, euro un %





Structure for the implementation of the general budget expenditure of Jelgava City municipality in 2019, euro un %





City population of long-term residents of Jelgava at the beginning of the year





Ethnic makeup at the beginning of 2020, %





Jelgava population, gender structure 2011 - 2020, %







2011.-2019.g.**





Number of children and lack of pre-primary schools places to child ratio in Jelgava city in 2010./2011. – 2019./2020.







Attendance of the seminars organized by Competence Development Center of the Zemgale Region, 2005 - 2019





9th grade graduate choice between job or studies %









Number of registered unemployed by gender and problem groups in 2018-2019







The average monthly gross salary in public sector in Latvia and the largest cities 2015-2019, EUR (total, excluding private sector companies with less than 50 employees)





The average monthly gross salary in public sector in Latvia and the largest cities 2015-2019, EUR






Number of enterprises by type of activity in Jelgava, 2018







Road accident statistics in Jelgava, 2007 - 2019





Number of doctors in Jelgava 2011 - 2019











Number of served persons and number of beds in Jelgava hotels and other tourism establishments, 2010 - 2019






