Dear readers of "Jelgava in figures"

For the city of Jelgava, 2020 has been a challenging year, marked by an unprecedented situation in our country and around the world - the COVID 19 pandemic. This required the municipality to focus as much as possible on resolving the crisis situation and making accurate, balanced decisions. We have celebrated Jelgava's 755th birthday online and came to the conclusion that every challenge is a driving force for development.

However, despite the great challenges, significant changes have been introduced in the infrastructure of Jelgava, new smart technology solutions have been found in the urban environment, projects have been implemented to make traffic organization in the city more convenient and safe, and urban outdoor lighting has become economically and environmentally friendly.

It was important for the municipality to continue to arrange the infrastructure - to improve the living standards of the population and to ensure business development. We have managed to make Jelgava more modern, tidier and more attractive. The largest street infrastructure projects are the complete reconstruction of the Loka highway, the reconstruction of Neretas, Prohorova, and Garozas streets. In total, more than 30 million euros have been invested in these projects. The improvement of the Loka highway is also one of the preparations for the construction of the Northern Bridge in the future, which is important not only for the security of the city, but also an important issue for strategic development. Pedestrian safety on Kalnciems road from Rīgas Street to Loka highway has been significantly improved. The total length of bicycle lanes in the city has exceeded 35 kilometers. We have also expanded the centralized water and domestic sewerage networks in the city.

Expanding support mechanisms for entrepreneurs, last year Jelgava City Municipality for the first time created a grant program entrepreneurs could apply for with their innovative programs, innovative products and receive financial support. Ten new ideas each received funding of up to € 10,000.

A lot of work has been done in 2020, many new works have been started, so I recommend everyone to get acquainted with the figures, which provide an insight into the developments in the economic, education, cultural and sports life of the city. We each create Jelgava with our actions and works, so I call on every Jelgava resident to be active and get involved in promoting the city's growth!

About Jelgava

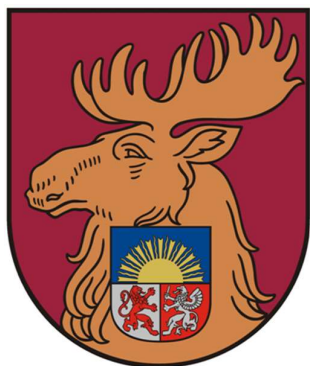
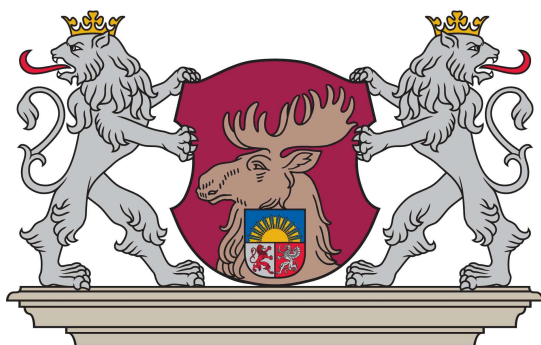
Jelgava is fourth largest city in Latvia by population and fifth by the territory.

Jelgava Large Coat of Arms

As approved by the National Heraldry Committee on the 24th of November, 2016, the Large Coat of Arms of Jelgava depicts two silver lions with heads looking backwards, red tongues and golden crowns, holding shield with Coat of Arms of Jelgava, standing on the silver base.

Coat of Arms

Jelgava is the only city in Latvia that contains the country's small coat of arms within its coat of arms. The city received the coat of arms at the same time as it received city rights, in 1573. The first coat of arms depicted a crowned stag head on a raspberry red field; the current coat of arms contains an elk head on a crimson field.

Flag

The City flag was approved on October 28, 1938. It is divided in two similar parts: dark blue on top and red on bottom. In the center of the flag Jelgava Coat of Arms is placed.



In 2012 Jelgava City logo was approved. The logo is made up of a contour of an elk head and the word “Jelgava”. The large antlers symbolize the rich historical experience and value of the city.

Jelgava is the only city in Latvia, whose coat of arms also heraldically depicts the small coat of arms of the country, which makes the official symbolism of Jelgava heavy and its use solemn. For everyday use, a lighter and more attractive city logo has been created, which stylizes the elk's head and the name of the city. The large and branched horns of the Jelgava logo elk symbolize the historical value and experience of the city.

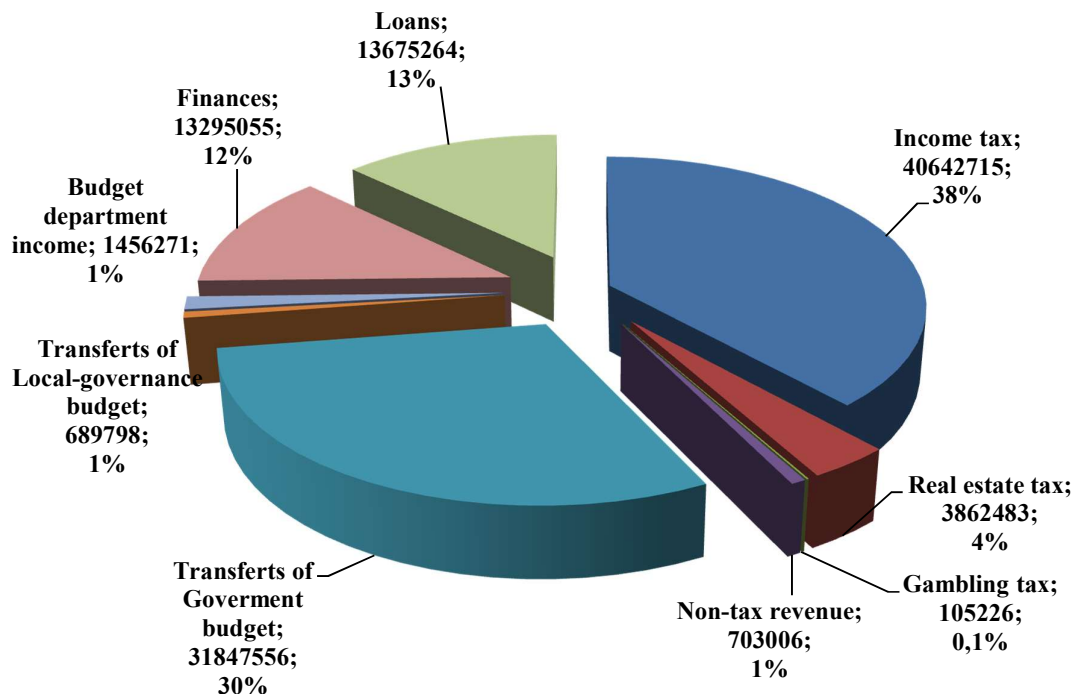


On March 20th 2012 Jelgava city logo and motto were registered in the Patent Office of the Republic of Latvia as the trademark.

The greatest value of the city of Jelgava is the people who live, study and work here - for their personal and city growth. Therefore, everyone here has the opportunity to find an area in which he wants to work, gain knowledge and skills, develop professionally and express himself creatively. These are growth opportunities from preschool to seniors.

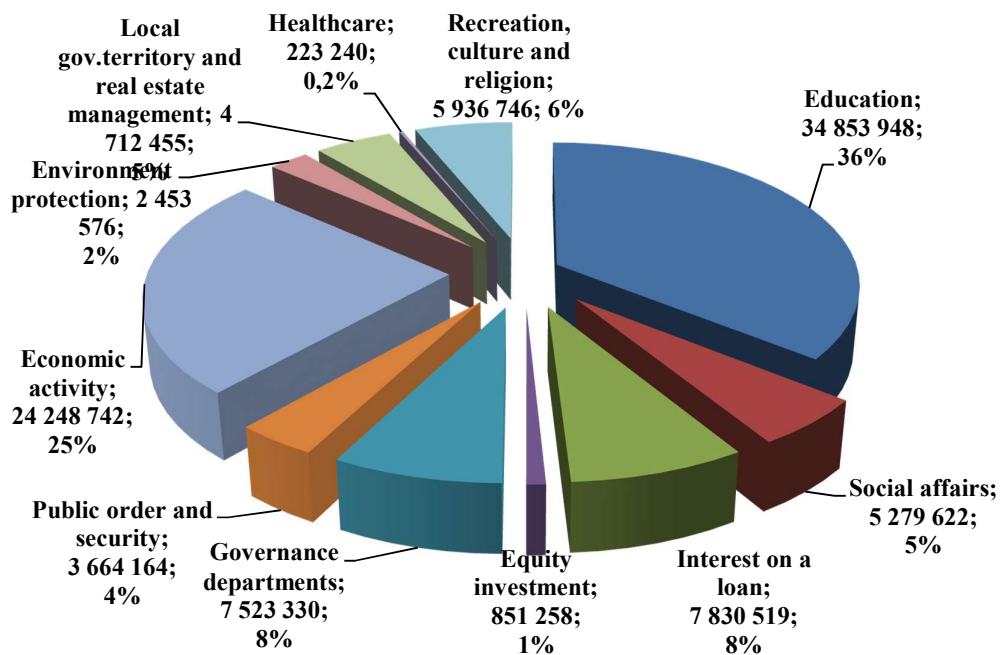

Structure for the implementation of revenues of the general budget of Jelgava city municipality in 2020, euro un %



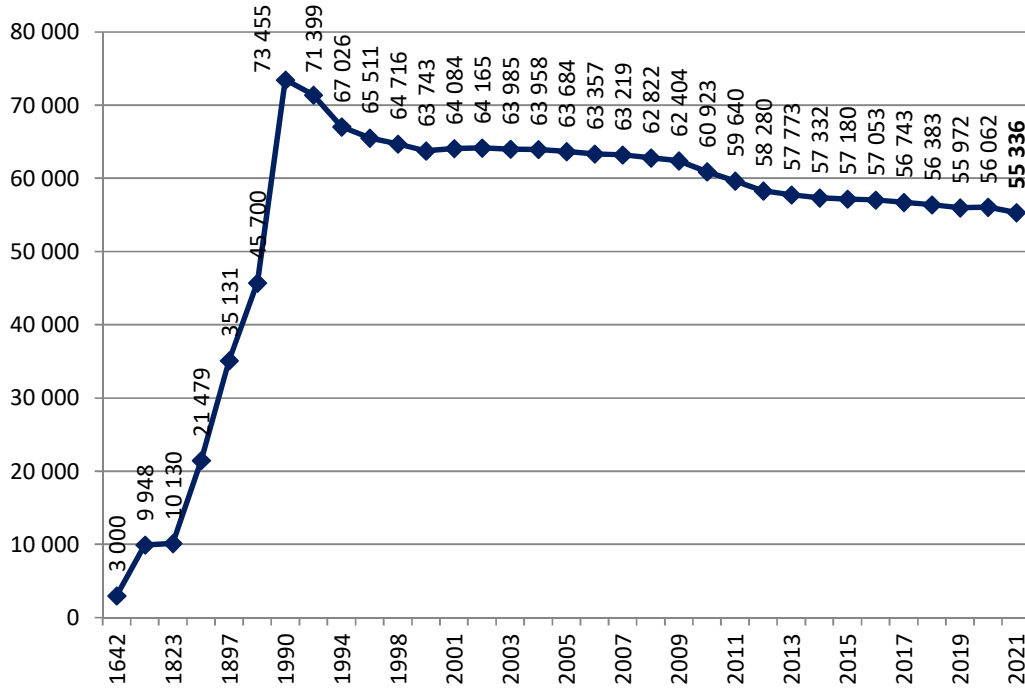

Structure for the implementation of the general budget expenditure of Jelgava City municipality in 2020, euro un %



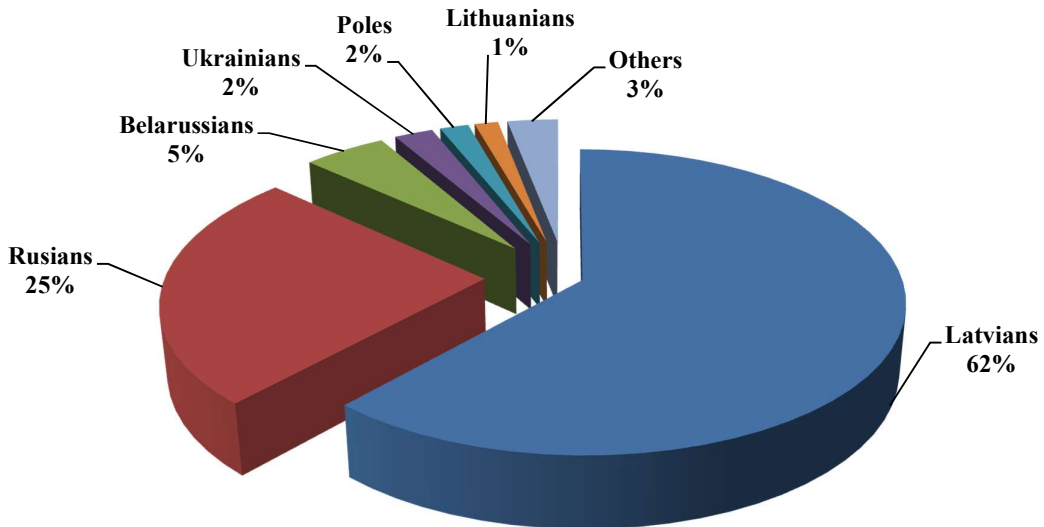

City population of long-term residents of Jelgava at the beginning of the year



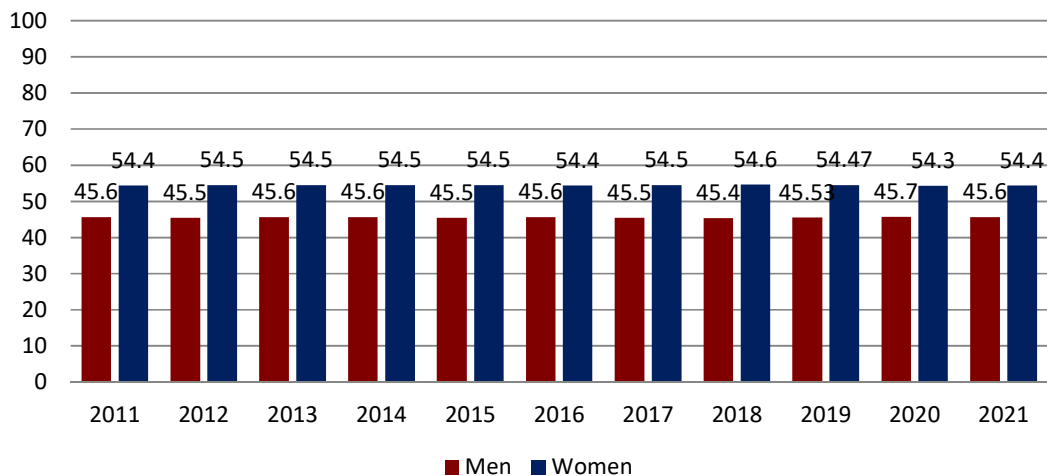

Ethnic makeup at the beginning of 2021, %



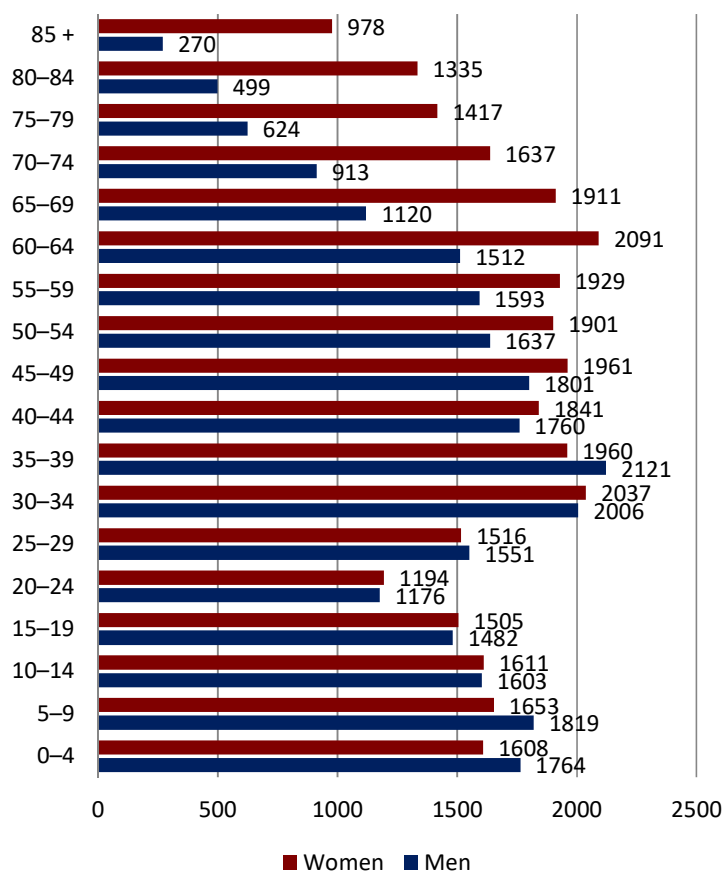

Jelgava population, gender structure 2011 - 2021, %



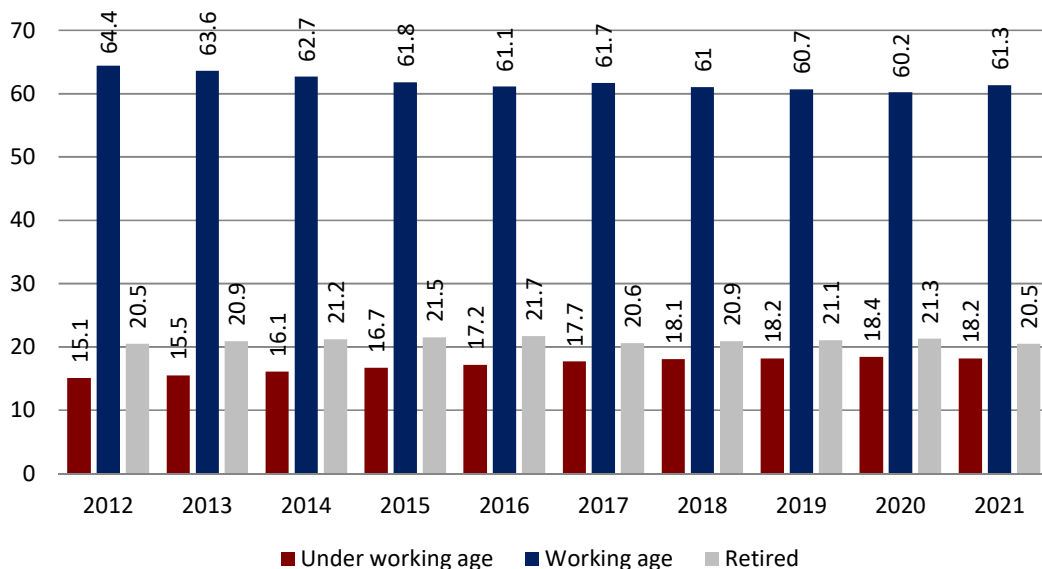

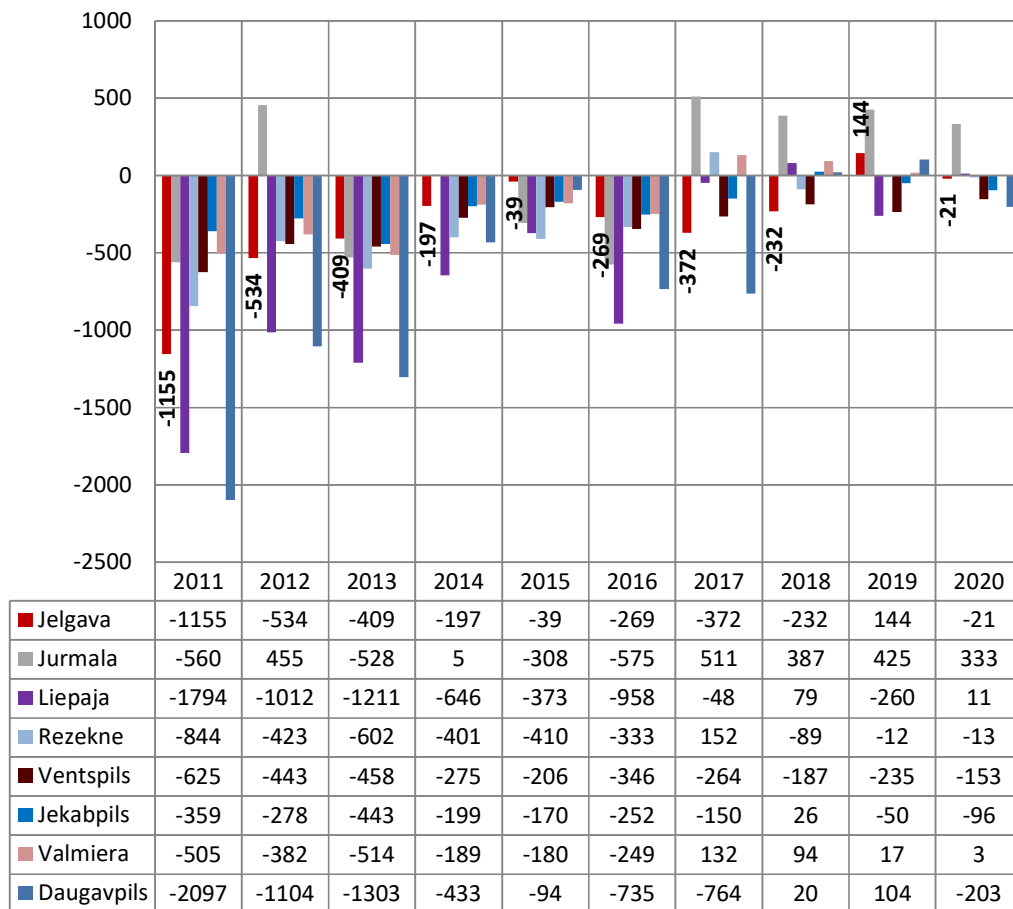

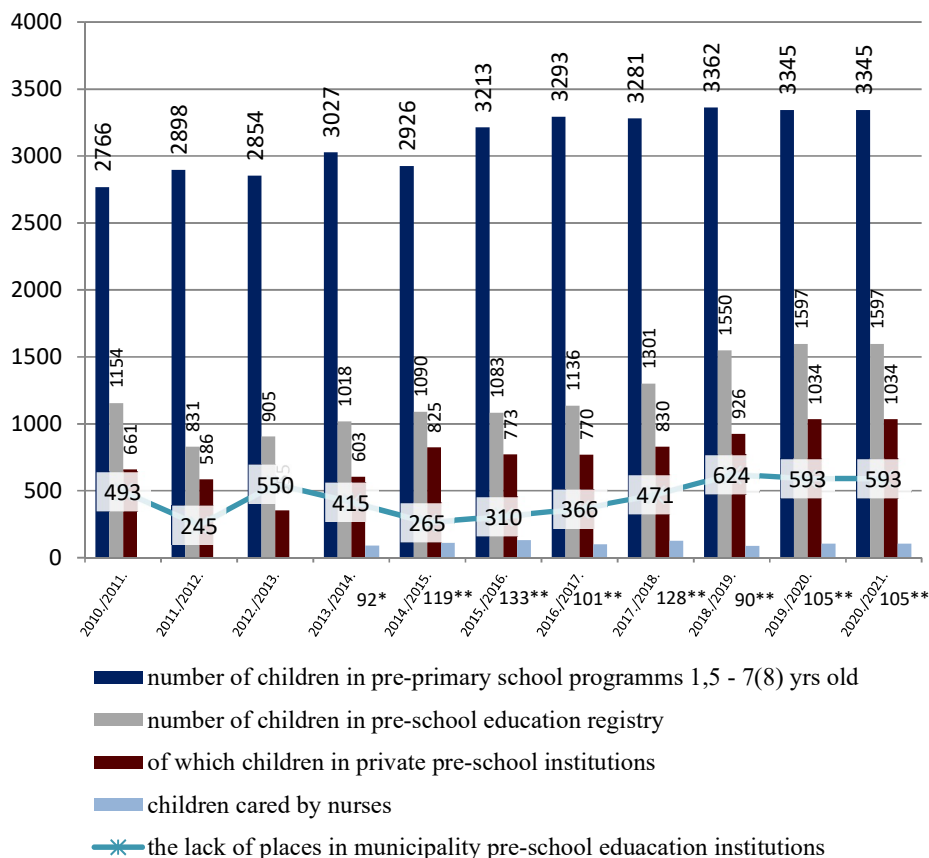

Number of children and lack of pre-primary schools places to child ratio in Jelgava city in 2010/2011 – 2020/2021

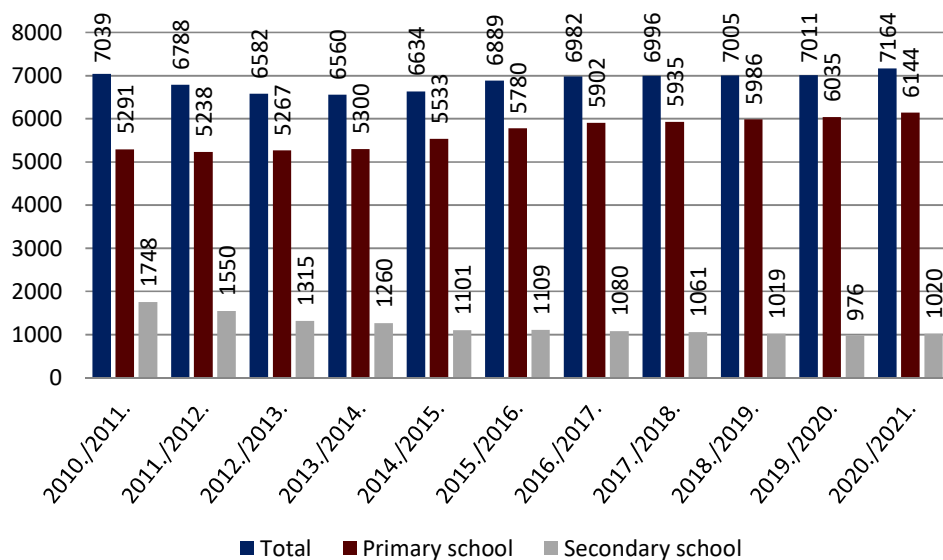

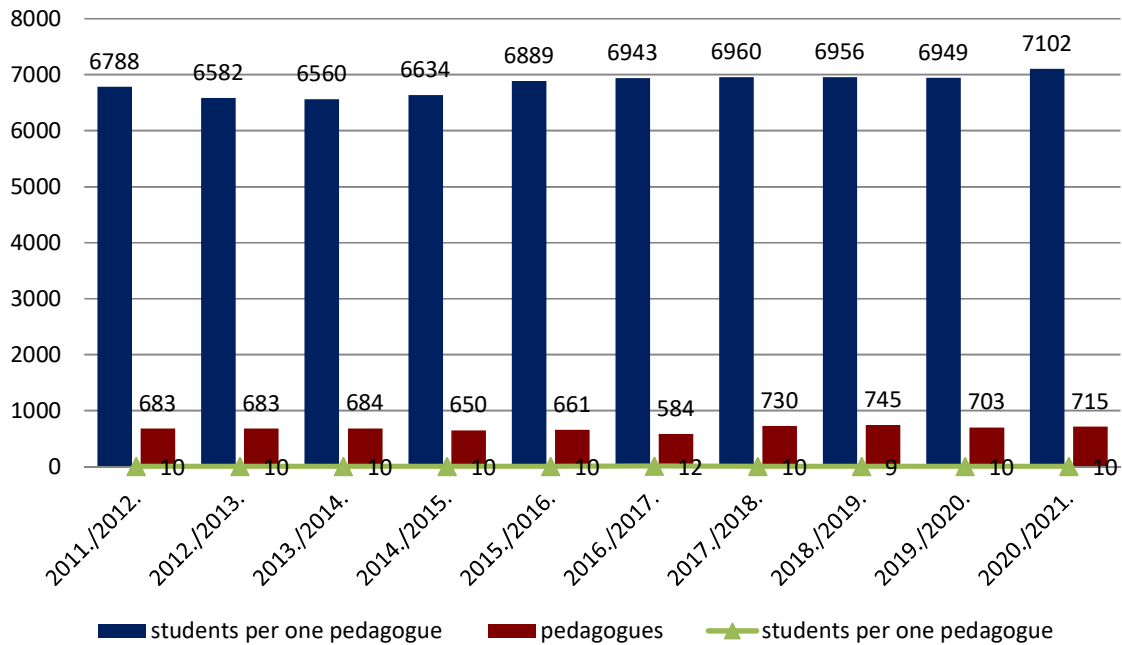

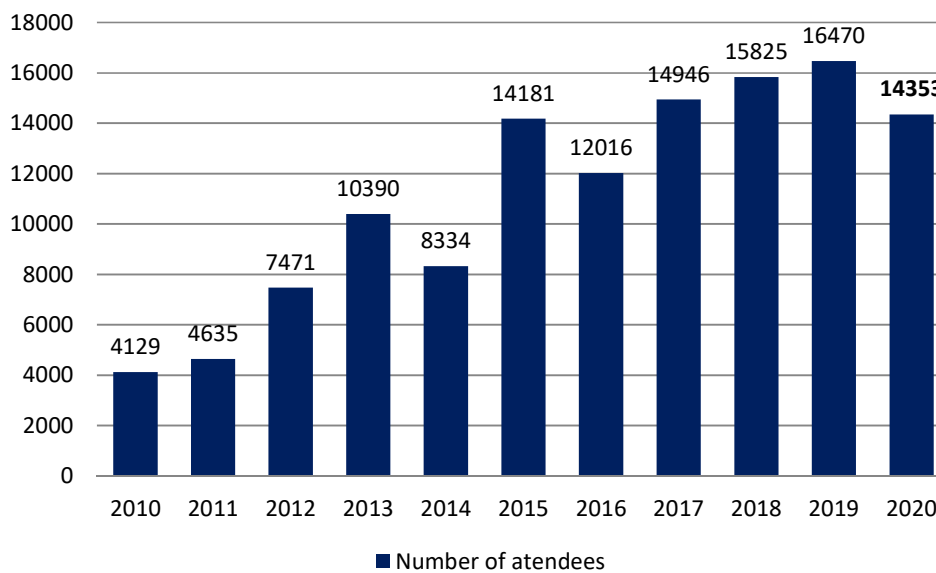

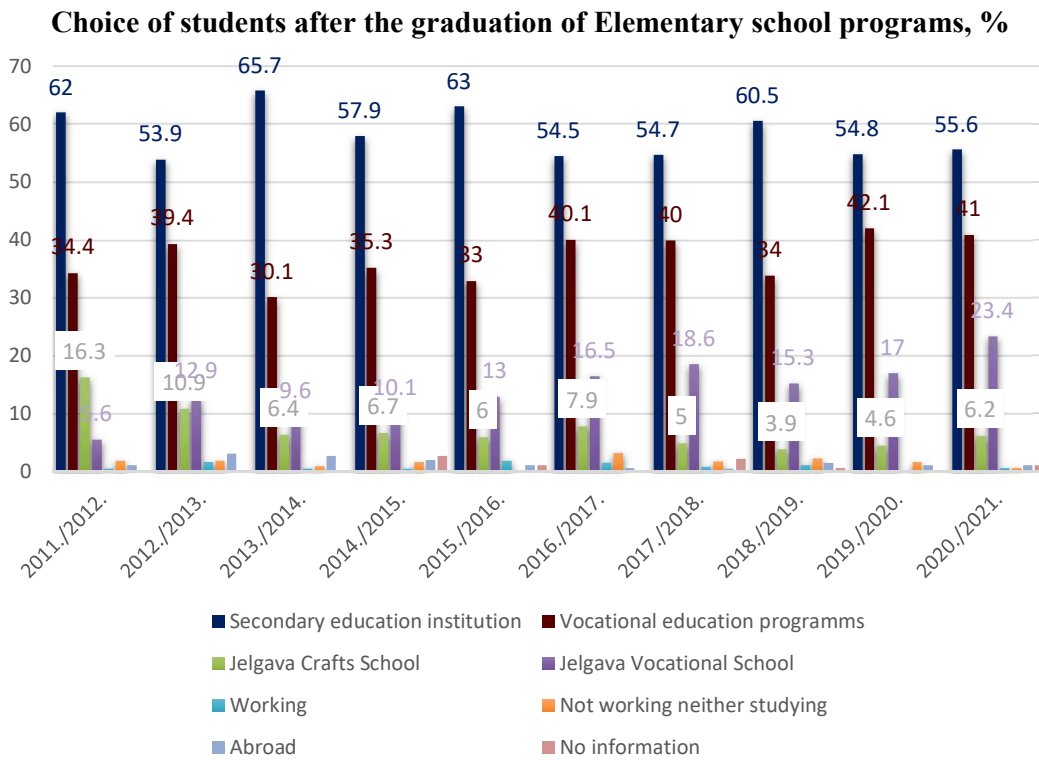

Attendance rates for educational events organized by Competence Development Center of the Zemgale Region, 2010 - 2020

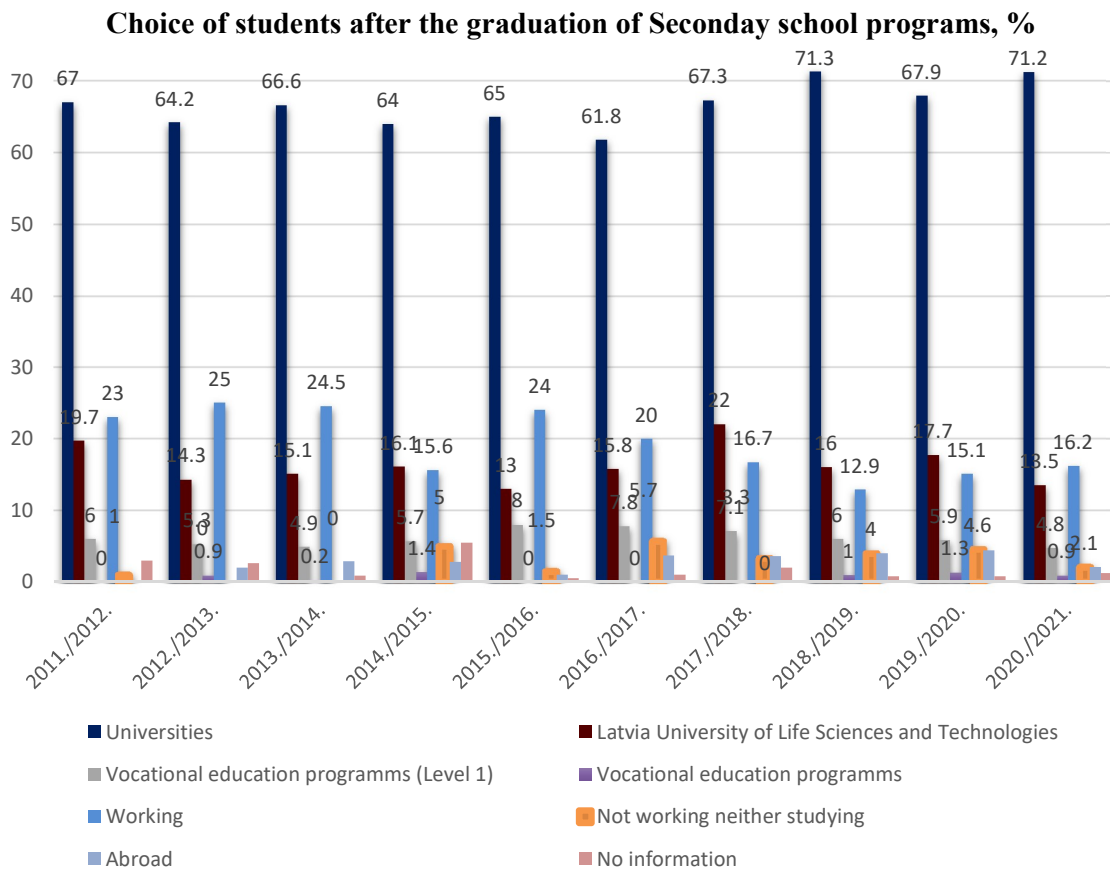

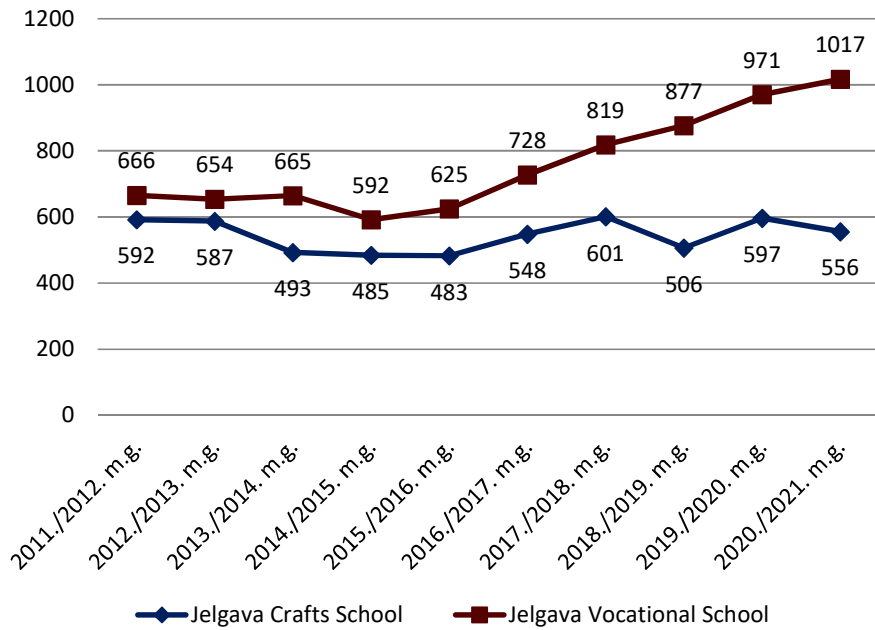

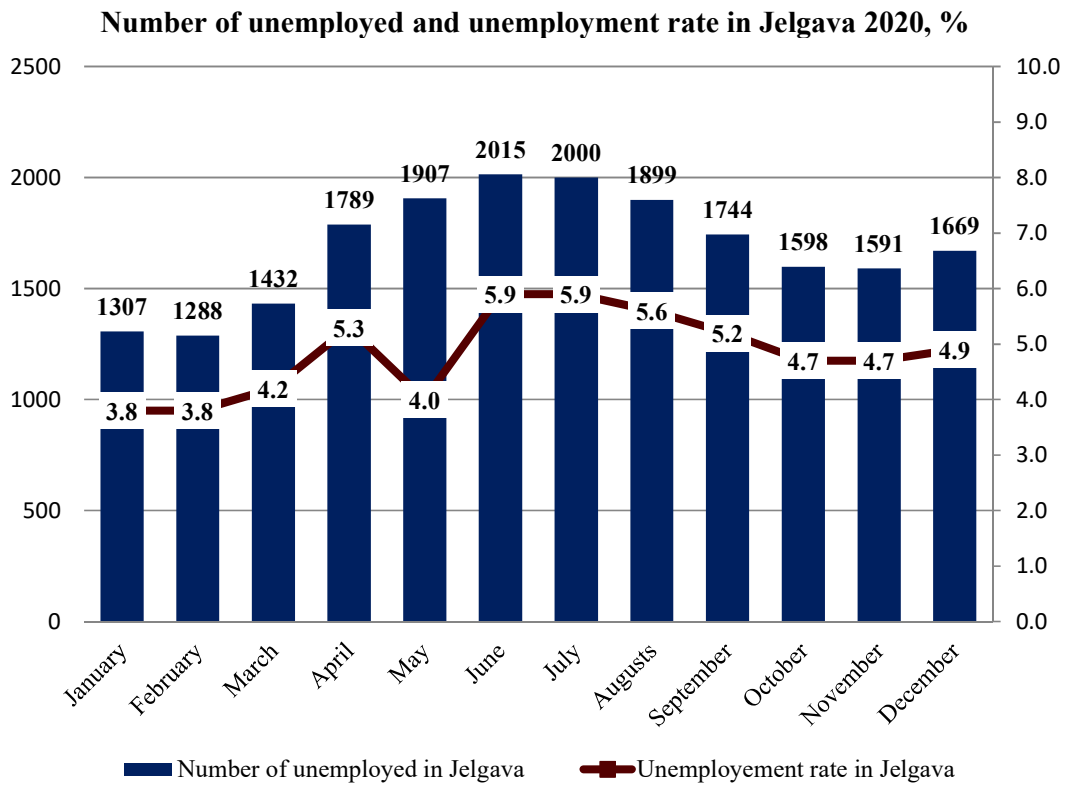
Number of students in Jelgava Vocational School* and Jelgava Crafts School in 2011/2012-2019/2020

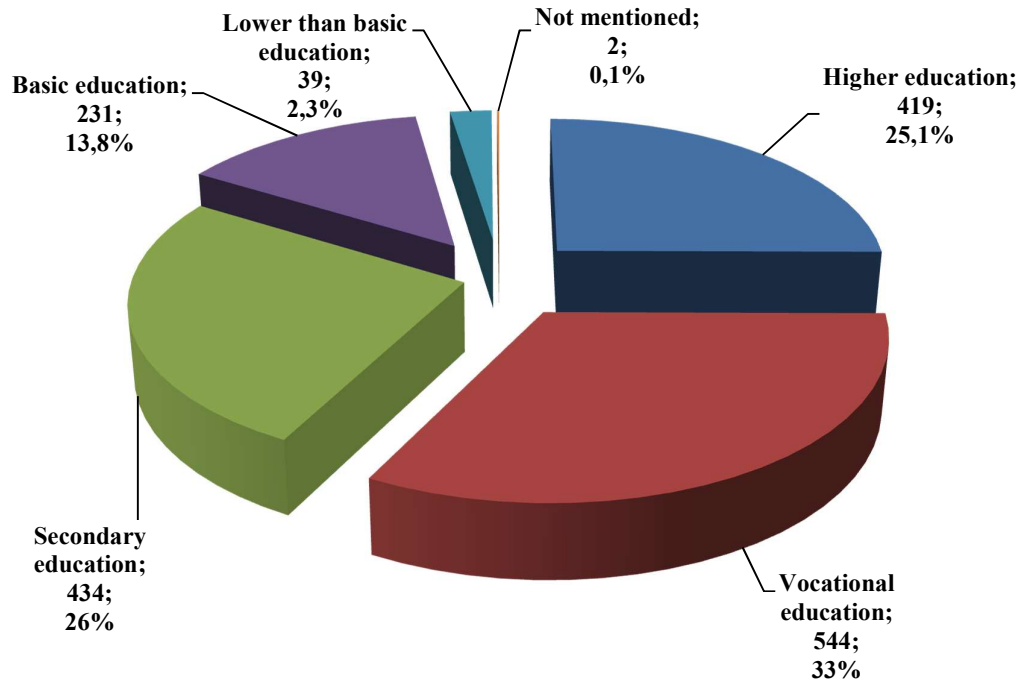

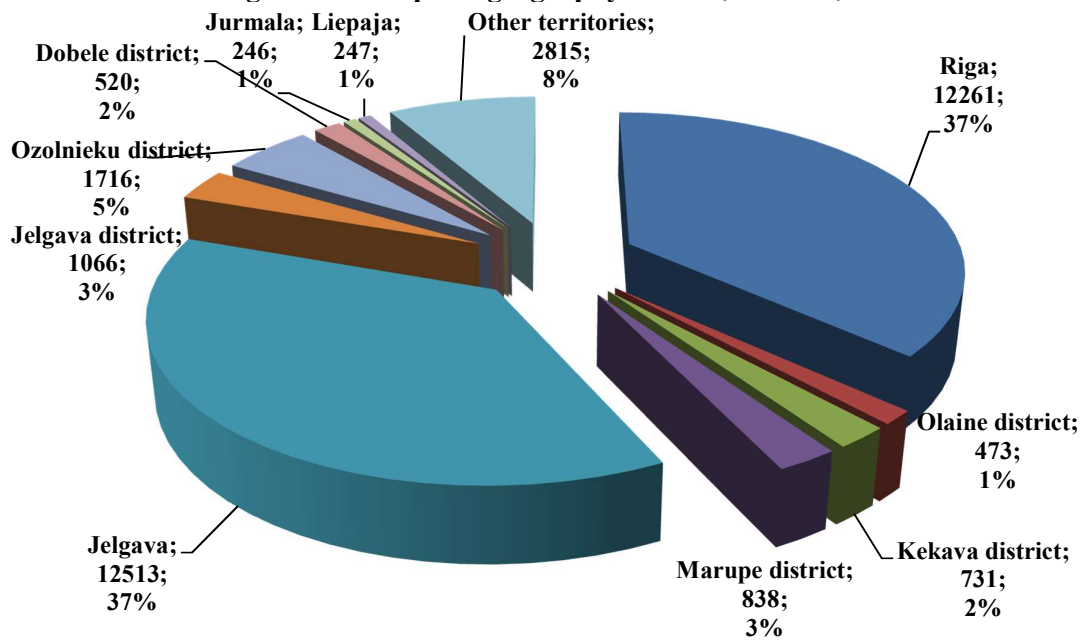

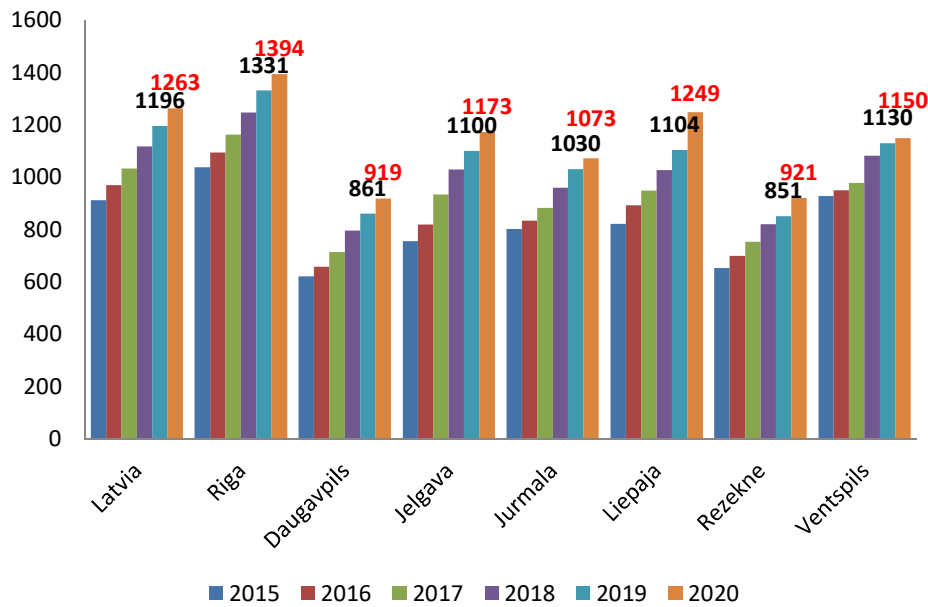

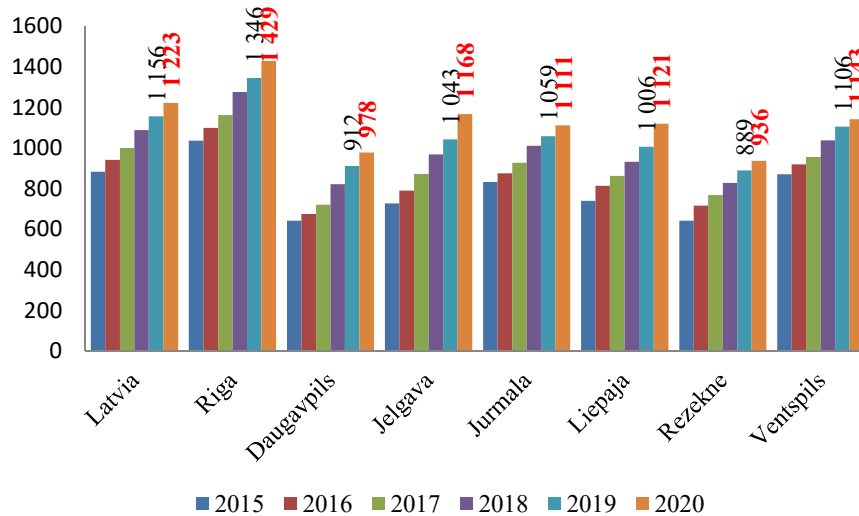

The average monthly gross salary in public sector in Latvia and the largest cities 2015-2020, EUR (total, excluding private sector companies with less than 50 employees)



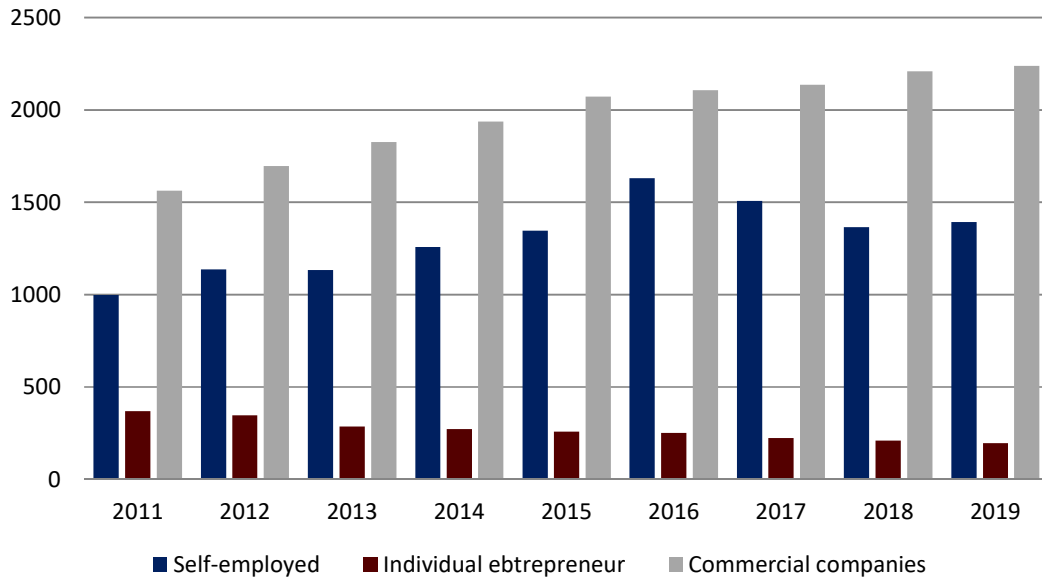

The average monthly gross salary in public sector in Latvia and the largest cities 2015-2020, EUR



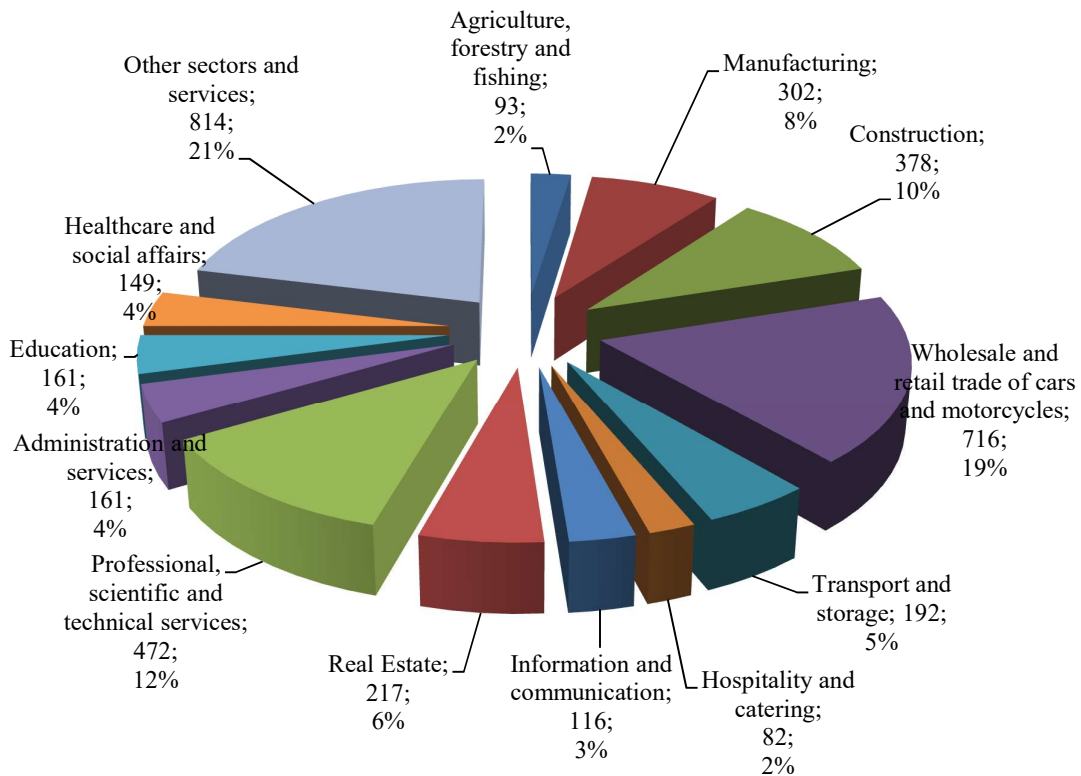

Number of enterprises by form of entrepreneurship in Jelgava in 2011-2019



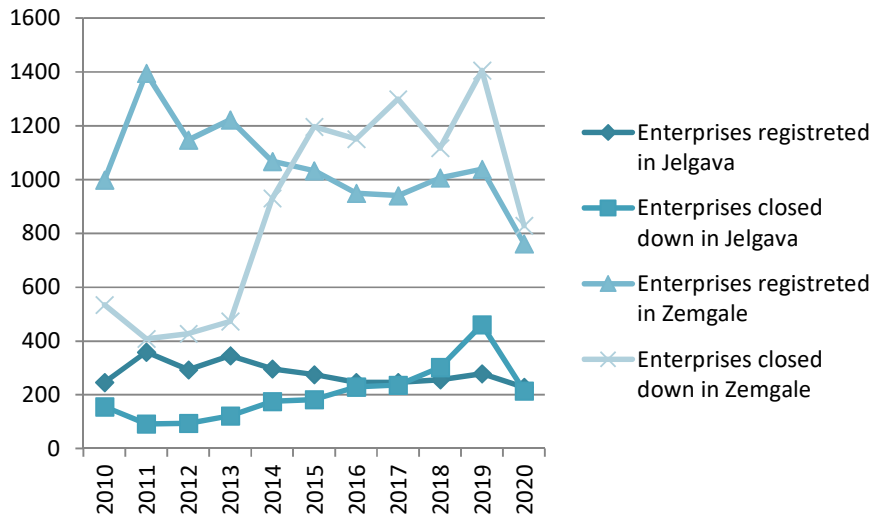

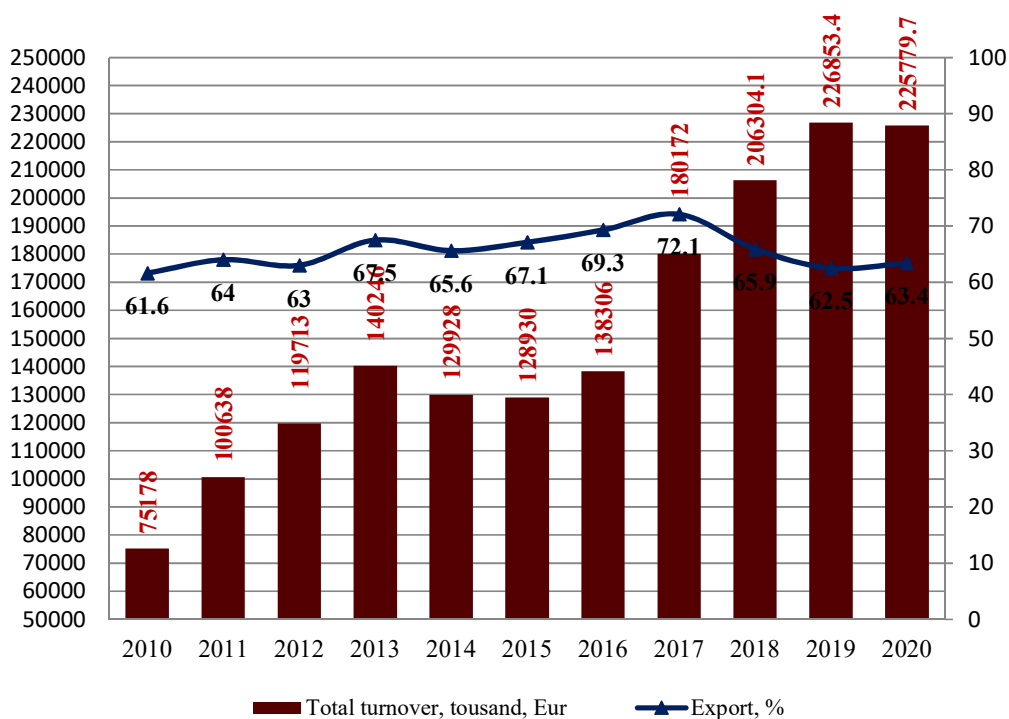

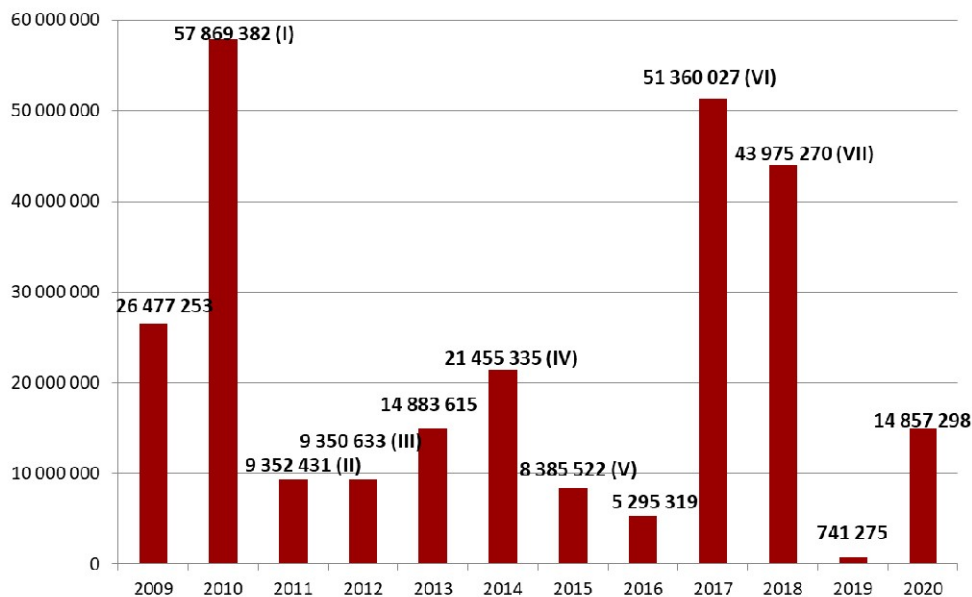

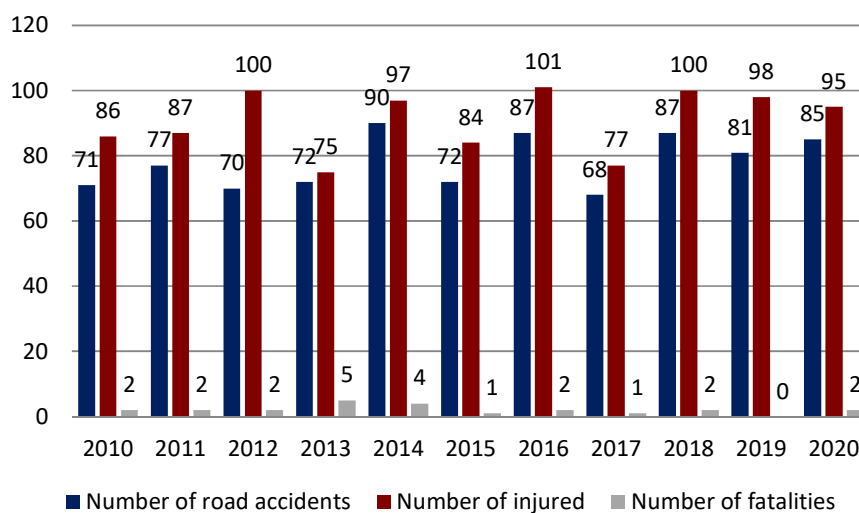

Road accident statistics in Jelgava, 2010 - 2020



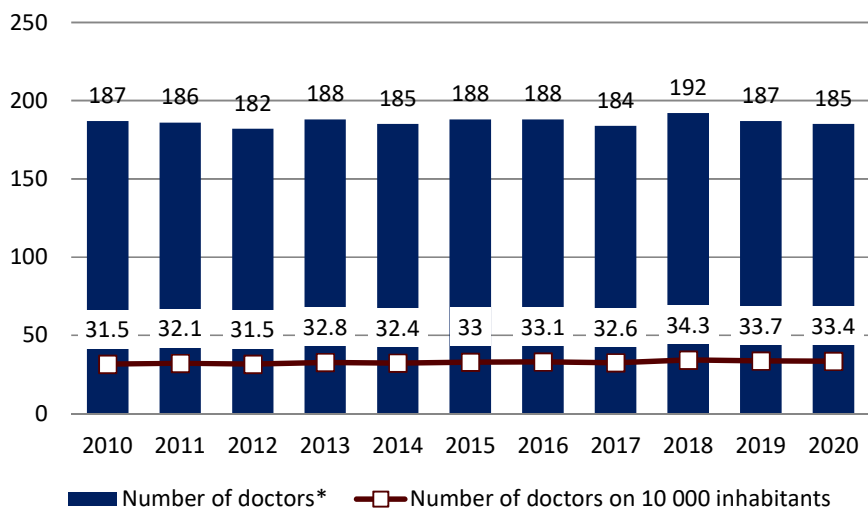

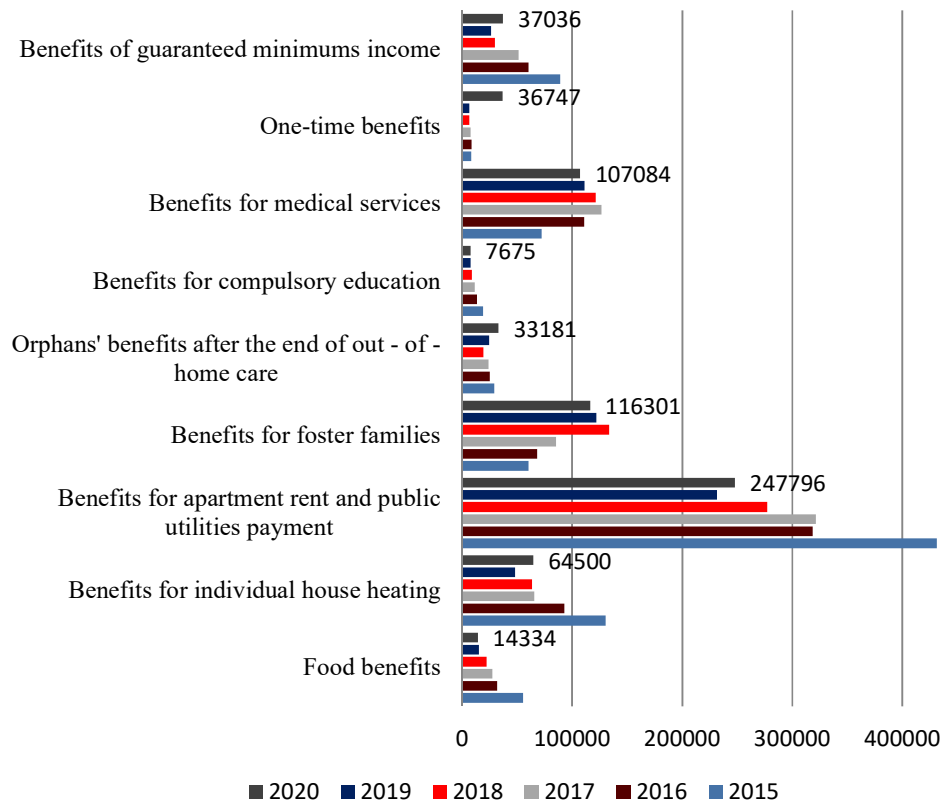

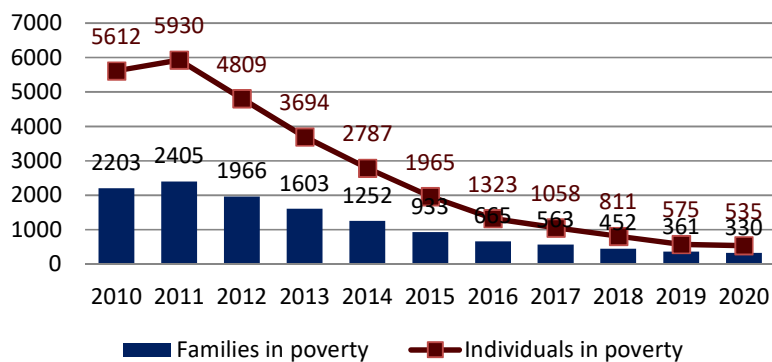

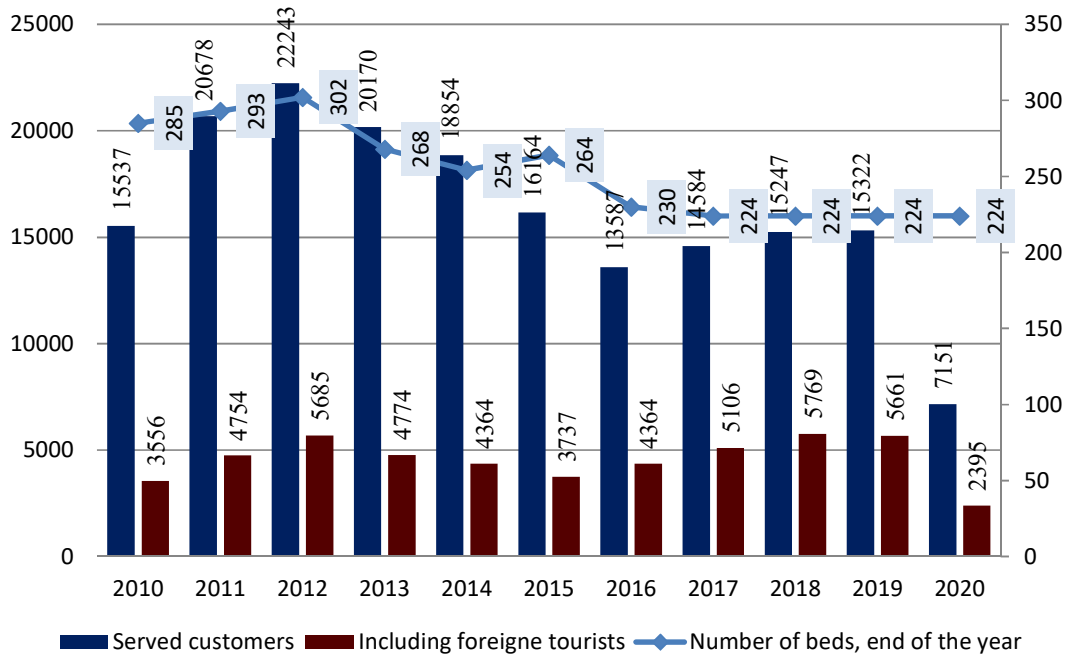

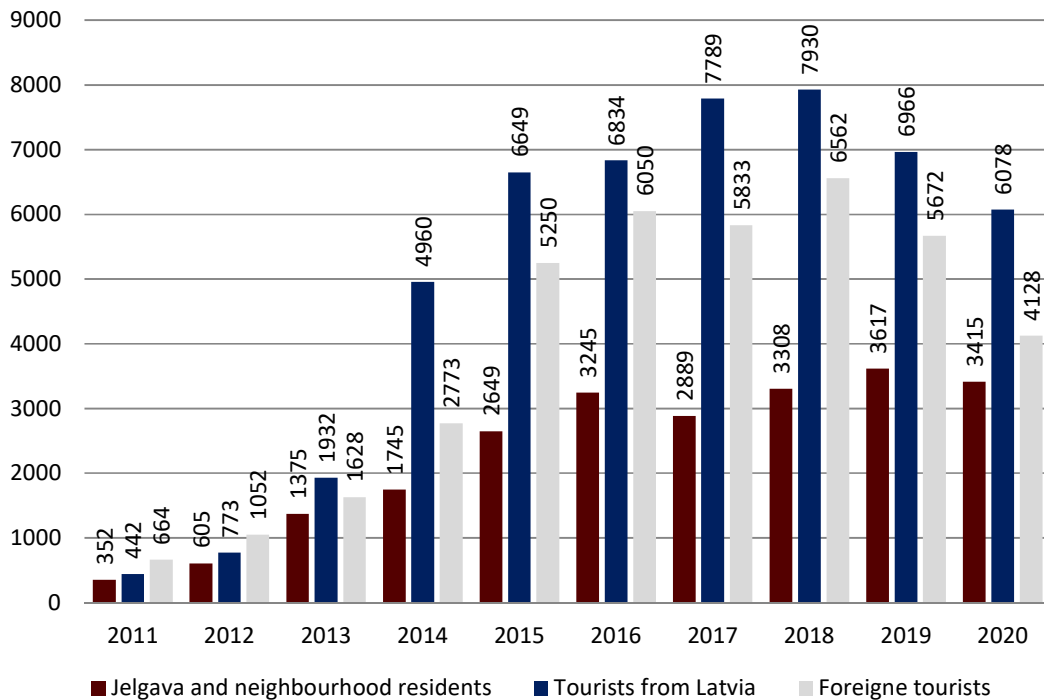

Number of served persons and number of beds in Jelgava hotels and other tourism establishments, 2010 - 2020



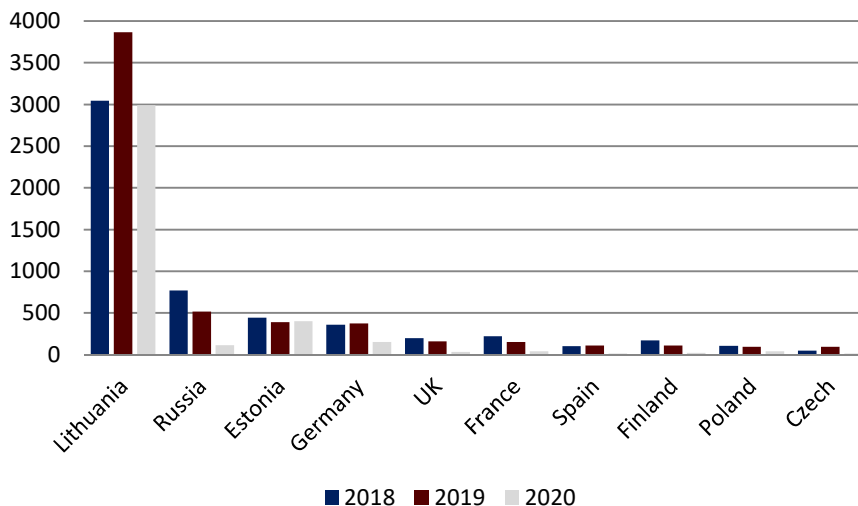

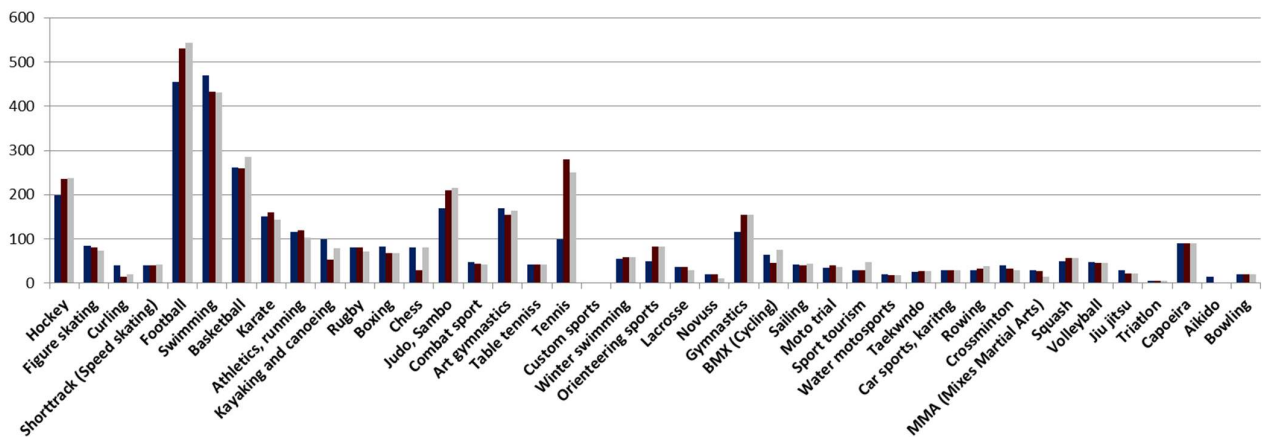

Number of Jelgava citizens participating in sports club activities in 2018 - 2020 according to type of sports



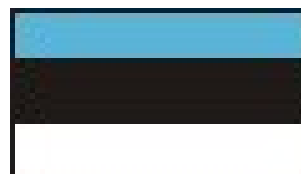
